

Activities to explore with SLT clients or client groups

| Demo | Prompts & Notes |
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| Try a question | Tell me about Big Ben |
| Getting our question prompt right | <p>Give me 5 facts about Big Ben</p> <p>Give me a quiz question and three possible answers</p> <p>You can tell it how you would like the answer.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Bullet points - 500 word essay - In 20 words or less |
| Looking at the answer | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Looking at the source - Will suggest more questions - Can attach a document (do not load anything personal) - Read aloud feature (only ChatGPT) <p>It will remember your previous questions</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Might want to start a new chat |
| Using the tool to make text more accessible | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Open a PDF and use the tool. <p>NHS Accessibility Standard</p> |
| Trying out the AI image generator | <p>E.g. search for “Banana couch”</p> <p>Free AI Image Generator - Image Creator in Bing</p> |

| Activity | Prompt and notes |
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| Problem solving | <p>Prompt - I have a Google Pixel 7 phone. How can I make the text larger?</p> <p>(Might want to prompt... write these as easy steps)</p> <p>Look at the features at the end of the answer</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read aloud - Copy - Good response (helps train the AI) - Bad response <p><i>Ask group/client if they have a question they would like to ask.</i></p> |
| Use it to explain a concept or hard to understand language | <p>Prompt - Can you explain thrombectomy in plain English .</p> <p>Ask the <i>group/client</i> if they have a word or concept they would like explained (like aphasia).</p> <p>To prompt you can use terms like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Easy to understand - Make it easier - Plain English - Use clear language |
| Therapy activities – creating a reading passage | <p>'Write two paragraphs about hillwalking in Scotland'</p> <p>Second prompt – make this a grade 5 level.</p> <p>Third prompt – make grade 2</p> <p>Fourth prompt – make questions about the text.</p> <p><i>(Be sure to advise that the text might not be 100% true)</i></p> |

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| <p>Answering an email</p> | <p>Email prompt</p> <p>'Dear Susan, We are emailing you as we have been unable to contact you by phone. Are you still available to attend your appointment with us on the 18th October at 14:00? Do let us know if there is anything we can do to make the appointment easy for you. Thanks, Anne'</p> <p>Add prompt – reply yes and say I have aphasia. Talking hard, no reading.</p> |
| <p>Creative – poetry</p> | <p>Prompt 'write a short poem about a black cat called Sam who likes cheese.'</p> <p><i>Group/client</i> can suggest their own ideas for this topic.</p> |
